this is what I know:

James Livingston Master Baker 1811? Died? Had the following issue

Alexander Livingston compositor born Maytown County Armagh 1841/1842 died Birmingham England 1890

married Margaret Browne at Liverpool 1863 and had the following children Eliza Letitia Livingston born 1864 in Liverpool died Birmingham 1900 James Alexander Livingston born 1866 in Liverpool died Birmingham 1946 Robert William Livingston born 1868 in Liverpool died Birmingham 1944 Joseph Archibald Livingston born 1871 in Liverpool died Birmingham 1897 David Stanley Livingston born 1873 in Liverpool died Birmingham 1936? Hamilton Browne Livingston my father born Birmingham 1883 died 1949.

These are the facts.

This is the half-remembered gossip not necessarily accurate:

Dad had cousins in Ireland who he used to visit before the First World War. He had an Uncle Joe who had lots of daughters and only one son could this be your grandfather? Somehow the dates seem wrong.

A cousin of dad's name to Sarah married a Willie Henry and they had a bakery in Newry. There was also a Neta Fisher and a lady named Wiggins who I called Aunt Lizzie when I visited Island as a five-year-old child I think she lived at Warren point.

As I say it is pretty tantalising and I'm certainly would appreciate if you are able to unravel the mystery at your end. Incidentally Margaret Browne, Alexander Livingston's wife, was also born in County Down about 18 44/45. Unfortunately, we couldn't decipher the place on the 1881 census it looks something like Mussel field. Perhaps you may be other help there.
